As preached on Sunday, January 2<sup>nd</sup>

**Read:** Micah 6:1-8

1. Are you a fan of New Year's Resolutions? If you do set New Year's Resolutions, do you usually include some that have to do with your relationship with God? If so, what impact have they had?
2. In the prophet Micah's time, the nation of Israel was incredibly powerful and wealthy, and yet they had fallen away from God. Do you think there is a connection between our own individual or corporate comfort and how closely we choose to walk with God?
3. In vv.1-5 God brings charges against his people. What are those charges?
4. In vv.6-7 the people of Israel respond to God's charges with a series of questions. What do you think of those questions? Are they appropriate? Are they sincere? What do they suggest about the faith condition of God's people?
5. In v.8 Micah reminds the people of Israel that God has already shown them how to live. When has God done so? Is this referring to the book of Micah or some other occasion?
6. As you re-read Micah 6:8, how would summarize what God wants from us as his followers?
7. In what ways will you commit to be a whole-hearted disciple of Jesus in 2022?
