Read: Mark 12:13-17

- 1. Our text opens with two groups of people sent to Jesus. Who are they? Who are they sent by? And what are they sent to do?
- 2. What do you make of the opening words offered in v.14 describing Jesus? Are they sincere?
- 3. Their question for Jesus comes at the end of v.14. What is it? What makes it a loaded question?
- 4. What does Jesus ask for as he prepares to answer? Why?
- 5. What do you think of Jesus' answer in v.17? Did he really answer the question he'd been asked?
- 6. How are we supposed to know what is God's and what is Caesar's? How does the concept of "image" connect with this?
- 7. It's been suggested that Jesus encourages a "loyal, but limited responsibility to political power". Do you agree or disagree? What does too little allegiance to government look like? What does too much allegiance to government look like?
- 8. According to Jesus' teaching in this passage, how do you think believers should relate to political power today?
