Read: 1 Corinthians 1:10-18

- 1. Take a moment to make note of a handful of things that divide the church in 2024.
- 2. How does it feel to know that over 2,000 years later the churches are still divided and struggling to live out the unity Paul calls for in Corinth?
- 3. Paul appeals to them on the basis of two foundations. What are they?
- 4. The believers in Corinth are asked to be "perfectly united in mind and thought". Is this even possible? Is this a call for church members to be in complete uniformity with one another? Why? Or why not?
- 5. What were the believers in Corinth dividing over? Does this still happen in the church today?
- 6. Paul makes mention of baptism in vv.13-16. What was happening? Is Paul opposed to baptism?
- 7. What was Paul's point in all of this? How can we apply what he shares to the way we live out perfect unity at FHPC even in the midst of our preferences and diversity?
