

SPUR ONE ANOTHER ON

As preached on Sunday, November 24th

Read: Hebrews 10:19-25

1. In v.24 of this week's text we're asked to "consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds." What does it mean, first of all, to "consider" this?
2. How would you define the phrase "spur one another on"? How is this different than simply encouraging each other?
3. Describe a time when someone spurred you on. What was it like?
4. Did Jesus spur people on during his earthly ministry? If so, list an example of a time he did.
5. Why are we to spur each other on to "love and good deeds"? Is there any significance to those two things?
6. In v.25 we're told to "not give up meeting together". What's the connection between this command and spurring each other on? What about between this command and our entire "One Another" sermon series?
7. As you think back through the eight weeks of this series, which "One Another" command was the most meaningful for you to study? (Love, Forgive, Bear With, Comfort, Serve, Accept, Bear Burdens, Spur On) Which is the hardest for you to obey?
