Read: Jonah 3:1-10

- 1. After his re-commissioning in vv.1-2, Jonah enters Nineveh. We're told he walks one day into a city that takes three days to "go through." What do you make of that? Did he do less than he was asked to do?
- 2. Jonah's message to the people was: "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." What strikes you about that message? Do you think it was exactly what God asked him to say? Or can we see a bit of Jonah's reluctance in the brevity and negativity of his message?
- 3. What was the surprising response of the Ninevites in vv.5-9? How can their response serve as a reminder to us that we're never quite sure how open someone might be to God's grace?
- 4. Are you surprised at God's response in v.10? Why, or why not?
- 5. Take a moment to read Jeremiah 18:7-10. Which part could apply to Nineveh? Which part could apply to Jonah? Which part might apply to us today?
- 6. How would you define the Hebrew word *hapak*? What is its double-meaning in this story?
- 7. How can we ensure that our proclamation of God's message in this world is not that of angry prophets but that of dispensers of grace?
