Read: Romans 8 (focus: vv. 31-34)

"If God is for us, who can be against us" (v31)? What does this truth mean to you personally? Can you share a time when you felt God was "for you" even in a hard situation?

How do you think these verses connect to the larger theme of assurance in Romans 8?

How does verse 32 shape the way you view God's generosity or His willingness to be for us?

Do you ever struggle with feelings of shame or spiritual failure? How do you replace these times with the truth of Romans 8:31-34? What would help you live into these truths more?

Jesus is not only risen, but is interceding for us right now (v.34). How does this ongoing work of Christ encourage you in your faith? I.e., What does it mean that Christ is both King and High Priest now?

How might these truths impact the way we respond to fear, opposition, persecution, or hardship?

Think about someone who feels far from God or overwhelmed by life. How could you encourage them through this passage and/or remind them of God's heart?

What's one practical way you can live differently this week because of the truths in Romans 8:31-34?
