

NOTHING CAN SEPARATE US FROM GOD'S LOVE

As preached on Sunday, July 27th., 2025

Read: Romans 8 (focus: vv. 34-39)

Begin by reflecting on how God has met you in and through Romans 8 this summer:

What truth(s) or promise(s) has resonated with your life the most in this season?

How has your heart been responding to the good news that God is for you?!

How have you joined Christ as an ambassador and minister to people (God is for them)?

Now, consider vv34-39 specifically:

How does the truth of Christ interceding for us impact the way you think about your struggles?

Paul names trouble, hardship, persecution, famine, danger, and more (v.35-36).

What situations in your life might feel like they are separating you from God's love?

How do you return to the joy of God's faithful presence (even in the midst of...)?

What do you think it means that we are "More than conquerors" (v.37) in the midst of suffering?

Share a time when you felt overwhelmed—but were reminded of God's unshakable love? What were the circumstances? How did it bring you closer to God and others? How did it build your faith?

How might our confidence in God's love empower us to take risks in loving others sacrificially?

In what ways can we reflect the inseparable love of Christ to people who feel abandoned, judged, or forgotten—both inside and outside the church?
